Earth Day - April 22nd



Celebrate Earth Day every day by recycling right! WM collects and sorts a significant number of recyclables from households across Chino Hills every day. However, many of the items placed in recycling carts are actually considered trash. Recycling contamination is caused when trash items are introduced to the recycling stream. Contaminants can include items such as hoses, wires, yard waste, and food waste. Recycling contamination has the potential to jeopardize otherwise good recyclables. For example, food or liquids placed in the recycling cart will contaminate paper and cardboard by saturating the materials and making them impossible to recycle. If it can't be recycled, it unfortunately becomes trash.

You can prevent this problem by following these simple rules to recycle right:

1. Empty all bottles, cans, and paper products before recycling.
2. Keep food and liquids out of your recycling.
3. Place items loosely in your recycle cart.

Free Bulky Item Pick Up

If getting rid of junk is on your spring cleaning to-do list, WM can help! Residents with curbside cart service may request the free pick up of household bulky items three (3) times in a calendar year. To schedule this service, please contact WM Customer Care Center at (800) 423-9986 at least 24 hours in advance of your regular collection day.

- Residents may place up to ten (10) bulky items or ten (10) bags of yard waste per bulky waste collection request.
- Bulky items can include couches, washers, dryers, refrigerators, and electronic waste.
- Items are to be placed curbside and will be collected on your regular collection day.



Holidays

WM observes the following holidays. When your collection day falls on/or after one of these holidays, your collection will be delayed by one day that week only.

Spring is the Perfect Season to Start Composting!



Planning to grow flowers or vegetables in your garden this spring? Try composting! It's a great way to reduce food waste while creating a nutrient-rich, organic fertilizer for your garden! Food scraps you would typically throw away like banana peels, apple cores, and egg shells are the perfect ingredients for your compost pile. Coffee grounds are also great for helping your garden grow. Here are the three basic ingredients to a successful compost pile:

- 1. Organic material:** Greens (food scraps, yard trimmings, grass) and Browns (dry leaves, sawdust, straw, wood ashes, newspaper)
- 2. Water:** Add water occasionally to moisten the pile.
- 3. Air:** Mix the pile every two weeks to add air to the pile.

Backyard Service

WM provides qualified disabled cart customers with backyard service at no additional charge. Drivers will assist by taking carts out to the curbside for service and return the carts to the designated location. Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

WM will not collect solid or liquid HHW. HHW is any product labeled: toxic, poison, combustible, corrosive, flammable, or irritant that is disposed of. HHW examples include paint (latex and oil-based), pesticides, pool chemicals, batteries, solvents, and explosive items. Chino Hills residents can drop off their HHW on the 2nd and 4th Saturday of each month from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the City of Chino Public Works Service Center, located at 5050 Schaefer Avenue, Chino, CA 91710.



Sharps Collection Program

To order a sharps container, please call WM Customer Care Center (800) 423-9986 and one will be delivered to your home. Once the container has been filled, simply place it in the mail-back box and give it to your mail carrier. Residents are limited to four (4) containers at no additional charge per year. Only one sharps container can be requested at a time.



Need another cart?

Additional trash, recycle, and organic waste carts are available for a nominal fee. Residents with a cracked or broken trash, recycle, or organic waste cart are eligible for a free replacement. Contact WM Customer Care Center (800) 423-9986.

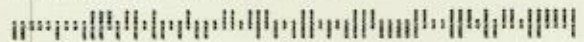
